A funding agreement with the Province of Nova Scotia's Department of Municipal Affairs matches the municipal contributions in support of Western REN Core Operations. This is used to leverage project funds through partners in both public and private sectors.

The Western REN's mandate is to **guide and navigate regional economic development** while supporting existing businesses.
